


HELPFUL SMARTPHONE APPS FOR READERS

The **Amazon Kindle** app is the best way to read eBooks online. If you are already a Kindle eReader owner, you can synch your library across multiple devices, including tablets and smartphones. Kindle Limited and Amazon Prime members can easily select and download eBooks directly from the app, but you can also borrow eBooks from the public library and read them on your Kindle app for free!



If you've ever borrowed an eBook from your local library, you probably already know about the Overdrive "virtual library" app. The **Libby** app is a product of Overdrive that provides user-friendly updates, which includes easier access to materials (eBooks and audiobooks) from your public library. All you need to get started is a public library card, and your public librarian will be happy to show you how to get started!



If you love reading, you know that it can be addicting! The **Goodreads** app is a social network for book lovers where you can create virtual bookshelves of books you've read, books you'd like to read someday, and the book you're currently reading. Users can easily get book suggestions from within their network of friends by examining one another's virtual bookshelves and by writing, reading and responding to user reviews.



Have you ever seen flyers inviting you to scan a QR code for more information? What's that all about? QR codes are actually an easy way for you to access a website from your smartphone. If you don't already have a free QR scanner app, we recommend using **QR Code Reader and Scanner** from ShopSavvy, Inc. The app is easy-to-use and helps you connect with a wide variety of virtual media content advertised on flyers. Who has the time to find a pen and paper to write down that long URL anyway?
